

"After May 3 of this year, any new station, or any existing station modified in a way that's likely to change its Radio Frequency Exposure profile -- such as different antenna or placement or greater power -will need to conduct an evaluation by the date of activation or change."

✓ Don't !





The OTARD Rule (47 CFR § 1.4000)

Applies to both municipalities and HOAs Requires exclusive use or control Allows satellite TV small dishes, VHF/UHF Broadcast TV, WISPs (RX and relay) NO PRIOR APPROVAL No height limit in rule, but maybe a building permit Tests: unreasonable delay, unreasonable cost, or precludes Must allow "acceptable quality signal" – but not "distant signals" Did I mention "no prior approval"


